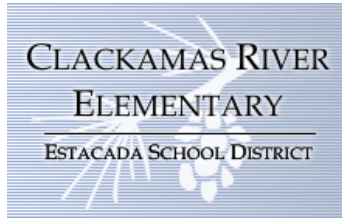


Clackamas River Elementary School Comprehensive Guidance and Counseling Program
